Who can enter?

Anyone who is a member of a BOC affiliated orchid society this includes overseas members.

Also anyone who is associated with BOC or affiliated to a society.

If you're not sure, just ask. Contact details below.

When can I enter?

Right now!! Today if you want to!

Final entries must be emailed by midnight **31st December**— we won't be able to accept any entries that miss the deadline.

Just warning everyone up front, so nobody will be disappointed and to avoid any misunderstandings!

What sort of pictures can I enter and how many?

The theme for the competition is

'A picture of an orchid or orchids'

So there really is wide scope for everyone.

You can send pictures of orchids in the wild, a studio portrait of an orchid or anything in-between.

The maximum is **TWO** pictures per person



How do I enter?

This year we are asking everyone to enter their own pictures by email.

We know that some societies would have problems organising this in the usual way, and this will ensure that everyone has an equal chance to enter. This is what you do:

1. Email your photographs to:

photo2020@british-orchid-council.info

2. Include the following details: *Your name, name of plant, your society name*

3. Make sure your photographs are in jpeg format. Any problems with that just ask by emailing to the email above.



How will judging be done?

As this is intended to be a photographic competition the emphasis will be placed on the quality of the images.

Please make sure that the images are in focus, with the proper exposure and well balanced/composed. They can be taken on any sort of camera and smart phone pictures are welcome!!

Details of judging will follow in due course, but please note we intend to get results out by the end of January next year.
