Editorial

At the last BOC Meeting in July, it was agreed that the closing date for voting for the Photographic Competition will be changed back to the last day in February. Therefore it was agreed to change back to the old arrangement where pictures are submitted by the end of the year, and voting takes place between 1st January and the end of February.

No change has been made to the classification of the photographs - remaining as always as one single class, it being "The best photograph of the best orchid".
